
Welcome to Ouyen! A Handbook to Knowing Your Community



Ouyen Inc. is our town's progress society. Some of our recent major projects and achievements include:

1. Building Ouyen Lake -

In 2013, the community identified an opportunity to improve the liveability and vibrancy of our town. The idea was to develop a disused dam, to create a new man-made recreational lake for community use.

Since then, approximately \$4 Million dollars of in-kind work has been donated, co-ordinated by Ouyen Inc, to create what we enjoy today.

Ouyen Lake is a favourite spot in town to:

- Enjoy a stroll, run or cycle around the Lake walking track.
- Try your luck at angling (with a reserve of fish topped up regularly), including from our floating pontoons.
- Enjoy the thrill of water sports including wakeboarding, canoeing, kayaking & water skiing
- Take a refreshing swim or dip in the water.
- Bird watching
- Attend events and festivals like, Mother's Day Classic fun run, Mallee Root Festival, Wake board championships, just to name a few.
- BBQ Facilities, toilets, and playground, ideal for any celebration, day or night

















2. Establishing Ouyen Community Gym

Back in 2016 the Ouyen community identified a need to create more livable spaces to exercise, and socialist. Ouyen Inc purchased a disused grocery building.

Thousands of hours of volunteer working bees, and donated tradesperson hours to create a community run, and community owned non-for-profit 24-7 access gym (including group fitness classes).

Ouyen Inc. strives to progress and improve Ouyen via the following objectives:

- To provide opportunities for all Ouyen residents and visitors.
- To encourage economic and social growth for Ouyen's future.
- To provide an enviable lifestyle in Ouyen.




Where we live.

Ouyen (pronounced "ohh yen") is a small country town located in rural Victoria (population ~1,000).

We are situated 441km North-West of Melbourne, at the crossroads of the Calder Highway (Melbourne-Mildura) and the Mallee Highway (Sydney-Adelaide). The closest regional centres are Mildura, 110km to the North, and Swan Hill, 150km to the East.

Town History

The township of Ouyen was established in 1906. The construction of a railway station saw Ouyen grow, particularly attracting farms tending sheep, wheat, barley and oats. To today, sheep and wheat remain the town's largest industry.

The Mallee Root is a symbol of our town as it represents the hardiness, tenacity, and spirit of our people. The populous Mallee root (eucalypt lignotuber) is known as a hardy plant that is difficult and stubborn to uproot, even when exposed to prolonged drought conditions. Like the Mallee Root, our community withstands and prospers even in the face of diversity.



There is even a tribute to the Mallee Root at Ouyen Blackburn Park, where Australia's largest Mallee stump sits on display.

Modern day life

These days, Ouyen's main industries include:

- 1. Dry land agriculture (farming of wheat, barley) and sheep grazing
- 2. **Health** (due to the local Mallee Track Health and Community Service Hospital which services the broader region)
- 3. Education (due to the local P-12 College that services the broader region)

Ouyen is also famous for its "Mallee Prime Lamb", renowned for its tenderness and favour. Local Ouyen farmers come to the Ouyen Livestock Exchange to sell >250,000 head of sheep and lambs every year for distribution nationwide, and export internationally.

Ouyen's community culture is renowned for being warm, friendly and proactive at creating a better town. Some examples of the Ouyen's enviable community spirit include the ability to co-ordinate the construction of the **Ouyen Lake** and the **Ouyen Community Gym**. Both are real Mallee success stories; project instigated and driven by the community to improve our town's liveability, and vibrancy!




